Potty training success hinges on physical, developmental and behavioral milestones, not age. Many children show signs of being ready for potty training between ages 18 and 24 months. However, others might not be ready until they're 3 years old. There's no rush. If you start too early, it might take longer to train your child.

So, with toilet training, focus on praising your child for every success, no matter how small. When they slip up, resolve the problem (with a change of underwear) and move on. Most important, never let a child sit in dirty diapers as a “natural consequence.” Learning a new skill requires patience and understanding.

Finding a toilet training method that works for your family is the key. No matter how you do it, remember this is a learning process that takes time, with many accidents along the way. Being patient is the best way you can support your child as she learns. Keep in mind that children with special needs may take longer to learn to use the potty.

Learning to use the toilet is like learning any new skill – it takes time. Each child learns at their own pace and while some children will learn to use the toilet within a week, for many others the process will be a much longer one. Reinforce your child for sitting on the transitional potty for 10 seconds, 20 seconds, 30 seconds, etc. Once your child can sit on the transitional potty, encourage your child to sit on the “big potty.”. First, have him/her sit on the toilet with the seat down.

Toilet Training is defined as the process of teaching a young child to control the bladder and bowel movements and to use the toilet. From a Montessori perspective, we do not actually “teach”.
